



The East Hampshire Youth Council (EHYC) has decided to use £3,000 of their budget to fund grants to groups of young people aged 11-21. EHYC have named this project 'The East Hampshire Youth Council Money Pot.' EHYC's aim is to: 'improve young people's lives' so groups can apply for up to £250 for anything from new equipment to a team building or educational day trip. The panel of young people that assess the grants will include three volunteers from EHYC. To find out if your group could benefit from a grant please read the criteria below.

Grant criteria

Applications to the East Hampshire Youth Council Money Pot must be made from groups of young people who live and meet in East Hampshire aged 11-21. A group can include 2 to 100 young people or more but single applicants may be considered in special exceptional circumstances.

Applications must be completed by young people but an adult may support you. Applications may be hand-written or completed on a computer.

Applicants must have a supporting organisation, which must be a group with its own bank account, for example: a school, youth, church or other young person's group.

All sections of the form must be completed. If you need any help please use the contact details at the bottom of the application form.

£250 is the maximum amount groups can apply for each year. You can also apply to other funding pots or raise funds if the project costs more than £250.

There is no deadline for completing the application form. However, EHYC will let you know if your grant has been successful within 6 weeks of receiving your application. EHYC will also send you an acknowledgement letter to say that they have received your application.

EHYC are not able to provide funding for projects which have already started unless the project is ongoing.

If you receive funding from EHYC then you will need to show evidence that your project was a success. You can send EHYC: receipts, photos, evaluations and anything else that reflects what your project paid for.

If you are not able to provide evidence of project costs or you have not used the money for the purpose that you stated in your application then EHYC will invoice your group for the money back.
